


Agriculture Produce sourced to Thimphu from January 20 to 24, 2022

Agriculture produce sourced

A total of 372 mt of agriculture produce was sourced to Thimphu from January 20, 2022 till January 24, 2022. Daily, an average of 74 MT of agriculture produce has been sourced to Thimphu and distributed to zone shops and vegetable outlets.

From the total volume, 26 percent of agriculture produce were domestically sourced while deficit was met through import.

The Department of Agriculture (DoA) and Department of Agricultural Marketing and Cooperatives (DAMC) jointly sourced excess vegetables and fruits from winter vegetables growing dzongkhags to Thimphu. Cauliflower recorded the highest domestically sourced produce with 7 MT followed by broccoli (4 MT) and green leaves (2 MT).

Onion with over 48 MT was the highest imported vegetable followed by cabbage (40MT) and chilli small (39MT). Except for chilli, other agriculture produces were imported by the wholesalers. FCBL imported safe chillies that are being tested by the BAFRA.
